**Madrigals in West Littleton Church:** The annual concert given by the Bristol University Madrigal Ensemble was held on the 9<sup>th</sup> March in St James's Church. It was a most enjoyable evening and raised nearly £1000 for church funds.

### **PARISH COUNCIL NOTES from the Chairman**

1. **South Gloucestershire Local Plan** - the South Glos Local Plan Consultation Document (February 2018) is out for consultation until 30<sup>th</sup> April 2018. This document lays down policies affecting planning decisions in S. Gloucestershire going forward to 2036. The section which relates to gypsy and traveller accommodation on pages 96-99 is of particular concern to the parish council since it proposes to intensify existing sites, make permanent the current sites and drop the Green Belt designation if the site is in the Green Belt – it is thought that the AONB equates to the Green Belt in this context. To quote:

*"All existing and authorised Gypsy/Traveller sites within South Gloucestershire are proposed to be allocated in the new Local Plan as a permanent site for Gypsy/Traveller use. In doing this, the council recognises that many existing sites currently lie in the Green Belt. National policy states that the mechanism for enabling the delivery of these sites is to remove the Green Belt designation ("insetting") and allocate for this use."*

The parish council is concerned because this policy, if adopted, would appear to enable the recent planning permit of a gypsy/traveller site on Norley Lane, Tormarton (PK17/2008/F) to become a permanent site. This would overturn the current condition No.3 of the planning decision which stipulates that this gypsy/traveller site is for use only by the applicant, his wife and his dependants and as long as the applicant is defined as a gypsy/traveller.

2. **Tormarton Park & Share Site** – Alice Jenkins, Transport and Environment Policy Manager for S. Glos Council will attend the next parish council meeting on 9<sup>th</sup> April to explain the future plan for a park & share facility at Tormarton. The parish council meeting is open to the public and everyone is welcome.
3. **Training on Defibrillator Use and Life Support** – Louise Cooper from the South Western Ambulance Service will hold a training session on Basic Life Support, CPR and defibrillator use on Wednesday 18<sup>th</sup> April at 7.30 pm in the Parish Hall. This session will last for no more than two hours and will include an illustrated presentation, practical demonstrations and an opportunity to practise with manikins and training defibrillators. This event was prompted by a recent medical emergency in Tormarton when it was realised that local residents need to be able to react appropriately in emergency situations before the arrival of trained paramedics.
4. **The Next Meeting of the Parish Council** will be held in the Hall Committee Room on Monday 9<sup>th</sup> April starting at 6.30 pm.
