# String Duo Concert, St. James' Church West Littleton, Sunday 17th June 3 pm

There will be a short afternoon concert at West Littleton on Sunday 17<sup>th</sup> June, with tea and cakes afterwards, to raise funds for a CD being recorded in June by the Illyria Consort, led by Bojan Cicic. Bojan was part of the string quartet from the Academy of Ancient Music that gave a concert in West Littleton last October. The recording is of Jarnovic's violin concertos and is being recorded in St Michael and All Angels, Summertown, in June.

Ivan Mane Jarnovic, was among the most famous European violinists of the late 18th century. After a successful decade in Paris in the 1770s, Jarnovic moved through Europe, living in Berlin, Vienna, and London, (even playing in Bath), before finally settling at the Court of Catherine the Great in St Petersburg as one of her chamber musicians.

# **PARISH COUNCIL NOTES from the Chairman**

- 1. **Parish Councillor Vacancy** After 11 years' service on the parish council Cllr Mike Horgan has decided to resign. The councillors and clerk thank him for his work on the parish council and wish him well for the future. There is now a vacancy for a parish councillor to replace Cllr Horgan and anyone who is interested in serving on the parish council should contact Gill Penberth, Tormarton Parish Clerk, for further details (tel. 01454 218186 or 07976 820805).
- 2. Village Defibrillators Following the public meeting last month on Basic Life Support, CPR and defibrillator use the parish council has decided to install a defibrillator in each of the two villages in the parish. In order that these items may be registered with the 999 emergency services two people from each village need to be nominated to monitor this equipment on a regular basis to confirm that it is in working order. Phil Turner and John Wells have volunteered to monitor the Tormarton defibrillator and we now need two residents from West Littleton to volunteer to carry out this task. Anyone interested in volunteering for this role should contact the parish clerk see above for contact details.
- 3. **Community Task Force** Last month a team of people providing community service visited Tormarton and worked on redecorating the bus shelter and clearing up the church yard. Further visits of this team are expected.
- 4. **The next Meeting of the Parish Council** will be held in the Hall Committee Room on Tuesday 19<sup>th</sup> June starting at 6.30 pm.

Ofsted Inspection: In March 2018 the school had an Ofsted Inspection. Having been rated as 'Good' in June 2014, we are very proud that we 'continue to be a good school' and our 'safeguarding is effective'. In his subsequent letter to the school, the inspector praised school leaders and governors, for maintaining 'good quality of education in the school since the last inspection' and he also commented on our commitment to improving pupils' outcomes.
