WW1 – Commemorating 100 Years from the end of WW1

This November we are again planning an exhibition in Tormarton church to mark 100 years on from WW1 and would like to include any family memories from that time.

This is a chance for Tormarton and its residents, old and new, to mark and remember the many affected by WW1.

Tormarton Harvest Service and Lunch - Sunday 7th October

There are two important occasions for the Parish to which everyone is very welcome; The Harvest Festival Service and Lunch.

The Harvest Festival Service will be held at **10.30 am** in the church. Harvest is an important time in the life of the village so we hope as many people as possible will be able to come to church to celebrate. During the Service there will be a collection of fresh, tinned and dried foods for the Sisters of the Church who are providing weekly food parcels for the needy in Bristol. A copy of the letter from the Sisters with full details of the most useful items can be found on the noticeboard in the church porch.

In addition to the donations of food, we are going to have a special collection plate at the rear of the church. At present the Sisters are spending over £1000 per week buying basic foods to supplement the food donations they receive. They make a little go a very long way, but with an ever increasing rise in the number of people needing help, their funds are becoming considerably depleted. We hope therefore that we can help. Please donate as much as you can. It really will make a huge difference and will support the invaluable work they do in many of the deprived areas of Bristol.

If you are unable to join us for the Service, but would like to contribute to the food collection, we will be leaving a wheelbarrow in the Church from Thursday 4th October until the evening of Sunday 7th October.

Harvest Lunch will follow the service in the Parish Hall at **12 noon**. A great opportunity for villagers old and new to enjoy each other's company.

Parish Council Notes from the Chairman

1. **Gypsy/Traveller Site Planning Application PK17/2008/F** – At the SGC planning meeting on 20th September the committee approved the application for this gypsy/traveller site. The Tormarton Action Group (TAG) is currently considering the legal avenues that are available to challenge this development. 3. **The next Main Meeting of the Parish Council** will be held in the Hall Committee Room on **Thursday 18th October** starting at 6.30 pm. **An extraordinary parish council meeting** is also due to be held at the beginning of October to discuss two planning applications.
