**Tormarton Church re-ordering**

Thanks to everyone who came to the drop-in meeting on Tuesday 21<sup>st</sup> May when we met with George Chedburn, our architect, who described the current proposals for the reordering of the church. As well as options for our church, George showed examples of similar schemes in other churches - and we were able to see and try out various different seating arrangements.

In addition to providing a well-designed fully functional kitchen and toilet facilities, we discussed the potential benefits of improving the heating, providing more comfortable seating, enabling easier access both into and throughout the building, and creating a more flexible and usable space in the main body of the church. In order to achieve this, one option now being considered is removing all the pews, raising the floor level and installing under floor heating. We had a really useful series of discussions about these proposals which the PCC will consider.
