I have had a number of very kind offers from people willing to undertake a variety of jobs; shopping for essential items, picking up prescriptions, having a telephone chat to those living alone, etc.

As yet, we have not had any requests for help, but as the lockdown takes full effect in the coming weeks, I am expecting that to change. We are fortunate in Tormarton and West Littleton that neighbours do know and look out for each other and this will be particularly important during these next few weeks. Equally, if you are concerned about anyone who may not be well networked in with neighbours, please let me know. UPDATE FROM THE PARISH COUNCIL

In these difficult times it is great to see the parishioners of our two villages pulling together to make sure that their most vulnerable residents have the support they need to help them through the weeks ahead. The Parish Council will be making every effort to support these 'good citizens' both practically and financially where necessary, and have already pledged to help cover their out of pocket expenses where possible.

We would especially like to extend our appreciation to Noreen Fynamore who has stepped in to coordinate volunteers and act as a point of contact for those needing support.

Following instructions to local government organisations all future meetings, including the scheduled Annual Parish Council Meeting that would usually take place in April, have been cancelled until further notice. We are hoping that there will soon be a change in the law that will allow these meeting to take place online, with public participation then possible in virtual form. Details of how this proceeds will be posted on the Parish Council website www.tormarton-pc.gov.uk and on the noticeboards in both villages.

We understand that there have been questions regarding how the parish council came to the decision on the amount for the 2020/21 Precept (Parish Council proportion of the council tax). An explanation of how this figure was arrived at will be added to the Parish Council website (noted above) in the next few days. As always we welcome and encourage parishioners to attend our council meetings (virtual or otherwise), and would like to remind you that we still have a vacancy on the council. So if you would like to be part of the decision making processes that will help shape life in Tormarton and West Littleton in the future then please get in touch.

March Events:

The Madrigals in West Littleton Church due to take place on 13th March was cancelled.

The Mothering Sunday services did not take place on 22nd March.

The Tormarton Churchyard Spring clean up scheduled for Saturday 28th March has been postponed. We will rearrange once the current restrictions have been lifted. In the meantime, if anyone would like to help (and take some exercise), it would be great if individuals could spend an hour or so strimming around the headstones where the mower can't go! Whilst we don't expect crowds (!), please observe government policy and social distancing. Thank you.

Future Events:

The Lent Lunch due to take place on 1st April has been cancelled.

The Annual Parochial Church Meetings are postponed until the current restrictions have eased, with a new Diocesan deadline of 31st October.
