## Eco Church - Tormarton

The last year has made many of us more aware of our local area and its wildlife. There is a national movement, called Eco Church, which aims to support our responsibility to care for our world. Tormarton Church has now joined Eco Church and one of our first projects has been to plant shrubs and small trees in suitable corners and edges of the churchyard; the idea being to provide more food for the birds and to soften the boundaries as some of the large trees are affected by Ash die back disease and will have to be felled this year.

The cost of felling the trees will have to be met from church funds but the Cotswold Wardens provided the shrubs and trees and we are grateful to Wardens Richard and Pauline Wilson who showed us how to plant and protect the young trees. Later this spring we also plan to introduce wildflowers to parts of the churchyard and would love some volunteers, of any age, to help us.

As far as the Parish Council is concerned it's been pretty much business as usual - an assortment of planning applications, consultations are being dealt with, and preparations are already underway to usher in the new financial year. We will be starting the year with a full complement of Parish Council members from all corners of the parish, representing a good cross-section of our community in both age and interests. Obviously, we have approved and budgeted works, such as the new road markings through the village, including a new layout at the Church Road bus stop, mitigating works to deal with trees suffering from Ash Dieback, and the long awaited traffic flow review, all of which seem to have been endlessly put on hold due to Covid-19.

However, our councillors are always keen to hear about new ideas and projects that we could potentially champion through 2021, and there are even small grants available for projects that would specifically benefit the communities within the parish.
