On behalf of myself and my fellow Parish Councillors I would like to take this opportunity to thank Nick for his time and effort over the last few years and wish him all the best for the future.

As you will know from previous newsletters, we have been looking for a new Parish Councillor for a long time now, and to date have had no interest from residents of our two villages. A small Parish Council like Tormarton cannot operate effectively (or possibly at all) without it's full complement of members, which will affect, amongst its other responsibilities, budgetary and planning matters.
