# <u>GUIDED WALKS in the COTSWOLDS NATIONAL LANDSCAPE</u> – previously known as the Cotswold Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty

Every month the Cotswold Voluntary wardens issue a list of Guided circular walks in the Southern Cotswolds. This month they include:

July 1 - 7.5 mile moderate walk from Cold Ashton to Marshfield via St Catherines Valley and returning on the Cotswold Gateway walk 4.

July 4 - 5 mile circular moderate walk from the Fox and Hounds, Colerne.

July 12 - 8.5 miles moderate circular walk from Swineford Picnic Area taking in North Stoke, Pipley Wood, Hanging Hill, Upton Cheney and Bitton.

July 18 – 5 miles moderate circular walk around Box starting at Box Recreation Ground Car Park.

July 30 – 5 miles moderate circular walk from Castle Combe Car Park, out to West Yatton Down circling the Castle Combe circuit.

All walks led by the Voluntary Wardens are FREE OF CHARGE however donations are welcome and help the wardens to take care of the countryside.

# Nature Notes – How to help during this very dry spell

It looks like it is going to continue to be hot and dry so it is really important to provide clean fresh water in a shallow dish for thirsty hedgehogs and birds. Large flower pot saucers are ideal for this purpose.

## **Nature Notes – continued**

**Hedgehog care** - Please do remember that every year hedgehogs are injured or killed by strimmers and mowers; so always check long grassy areas before strimming or mowing.

**A welcome return of the swifts** – Are you enjoying the glorious sight and sound of the swifts as they screech across the summer sky? The swifts are summer visitors flying 3,400 miles all the way from Africa. They are amazing birds that can sleep on the wing and rarely touch the ground. They have an impressive top speed of 69mph.

Swifts pair for life, returning to the same site each year. They like to nest in tiny gaps in the roofs of churches and old houses but as more old buildings are renovated their nest sites are fast disappearing; this is one of the reasons that the swift is now on the UK red list for endangered species.

The hedgehog is sadly also on this list.
