PARISH COUNCIL - NOTES from Chairman Simon Stevens

Firstly, as this is the first newsletter following the summer break, whether you have been away with the family or have summered in the comfort of your own homes, I hope you've all had an enjoyable, if slightly damp in places, summer.

From a Parish Council perspective, it's been a relatively quiet summer. Hopefully we will have some exciting news for you in time for the October newsletter, but at the moment we don't want to speak too soon.

So, with that in mind, I would like to take the opportunity to talk about the best way to deal with the thorny issue of complaints. Obviously, my colleagues and I are more than happy to hear about any issues you may have, including anti-social behaviour and planning issues. However, if you do have concerns regarding planning, safety, or an environmental issue, then please in the first instance, register it with the relevant authority, South Gloucestershire Council, the police, etc. Then by all means approach the Parish Council for support and we will be only too glad to follow it up. By doing it this way you will be helping to maintain the Parish Council's credibility, and therefore its power to successfully lobby on your behalf in the future. Obviously, if you would like help submitting your concern to the relevant authority, then please let one of us know and we will be glad to help.

The hunt for a new Parish Clerk is ongoing, and although Jack is kindly continuing to support us remotely from Jersey, the situation is obviously untenable on a long-term basis. <u>GUIDED WALKS in the COTSWOLDS NATIONAL LANDSCAPE</u> – previously known as the Cotswold Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty

Every month the Cotswold Voluntary wardens issue a list of Guided circular walks in the Southern Cotswolds.

This month they include:

Sept 5 -5 miles circular moderate walk from the Fox and Hounds, Colerne.

Sept 9-24 – Bathscape Walking Festival – a selection of walks of various lengths and level of difficulty – see full details at https://www.bathscape.co.uk/walking-festival

Sept 12 – 5 miles easy circular walk meeting at Bath Bus Station to take bus to the university, then walk around the Ralph Allen stone quarries, over towards Fairy Woods, past Prior Park Landscape Gardens and on to Widcombe Manor. The walk finishes at Prior Park Garden Centre, just 5 minutes walk from the bus station. Sept 19 – 5 miles moderate circular walk around Box starting at Box Recreation Ground Car Park.

All walks are led by the Voluntary Wardens and are FREE OF CHARGE however donations are welcome and help the wardens to take care of the countryside.
