Harvest Collection for the Sisters of the Church

Tormarton church is organising the usual collection of fresh, tinned and dried foods for the Sisters of the Church who are providing weekly food parcels for the needy in Bristol. If you are unable to join us for the Tormarton Harvest Festival Service, but would like to contribute to the food collection, we will be leaving a wheelbarrow in the Church from Wednesday 27th September until Monday 2nd October.

Refurbishment of Tormarton Church to create a hospitality area and servery

Prior to the start of this wet period contractors laid a water pipe in the churchyard around the outside of building to enable a supply to be available to the servery and a soakaway was created for the sink water. Thankfully minimal disturbance was caused and the grass will soon grow back.

It is anticipated that the pews in the South Aisle will be removed in early October and that works to relay the floor and provide a servery will commence in the second half of October. This area will need to be sectioned off and the south door is likely to be out of action for a month. If anybody is interested in purchasing a pew then please can they contact Stewart Waters (07775 648484). Hopefully the works will be completed before Christmas.

I am pleased to be able to announce that through the hard work of Katy Pool the Parish Council have managed to secure a grant from Avon and Somerset Constabulary for solar powered speed signs to replace the current versions that need the battery charged and are proving so expensive to run.

There will be a meeting on Monday 16th October at 8.00 pm at Tormarton Village Hall to discuss how we move forward the proposal to produce a Neighbourhood Plan for the Parish. If you haven't put your name in to be a part of this project, it's not too late! I am more than happy to go over the project with those potentially interested in helping and tell them what would be involved. <u>GUIDED WALKS in the COTSWOLDS NATIONAL LANDSCAPE</u> – previously known as the Cotswold Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty

Every month the Cotswold Voluntary wardens issue a list of Guided circular walks in the Southern Cotswolds.

This month they include:

Oct 3 -5 miles circular moderate walk from the Fox and Hounds, Colerne.

Oct 10 – A walk with Spectacular Views, 5.5 miles moderate. Meet at Bath Bus Station for bus to Lansdown Battlefields. Walking towards Hanging Hill, then south along the side of the Golf Course, picking up the old Roman road to North Stoke, then on to Kelston Roundhill and so Newbridge Park and Ride to catch the return bus.

Oct 15 – Iron Age to Nuclear Age, 8 miles moderate circular walk meeting at Old Sodbury Church. A walk along the Cotswold Way via two Iron Age hillforts and returning via a Nuclear Bunker and the Grickstone. Oct 17 – 5 miles moderate circular walk around Box starting at Box Recreation Ground Car Park.

Oct 18 – Lansdown Levels 4.5 miles easy circular walk starting at Lansdown Park and Ride

Oct 27 – Bristol Civil Engineering Walk 4 miles easy, meeting at the foyer Green Park Station. A walk celebrating the Civil Engineering Heritage of Bath.

All walks are led by the Voluntary Wardens and are FREE OF CHARGE however donations are welcome and help the wardens to take care of the countryside.
