It would not have happened without you Nick. It was pleasing to see such a large and diverse group of villagers help plant the tree which we hope to enjoy for many years to come.

# Refurbishment of Tormarton Church to create a hospitality area and servery

Work has now started inside the church with the removal of the pews in the South Aisle and lifting of some of the flagstones. We have an archaeologist overseeing the work and nothing of interest has been discovered yet. The floor will be relaid with the existing brass ledger retained. There will be some amendments to the heating pipes and these will be replaced by electric heaters in the South Aisle. The floor will be complete for the Carol Service and early in the new year work will start on the servery which will enable this to become a multi use facility.

#### PARISH COUNCIL - NOTES from Chairman Simon Stevens

#### Neighbourhood Plan

As you will know, there have now been a number of meetings regarding the development of a Neighbourhood Plan for the Parish, the most recent of which was Monday 9<sup>th</sup> Oct.

Having a Neighbourhood Plan allows a community to set out its vision for a local area and the planning policies for the use and development of land within a designated Neighbourhood Area. This could be in relation to housing developments, green spaces, transport, or indeed energy infrastructure projects like the ones for local wind farms discussed in the Gazette (21/09/2023).

It was apparent from the meeting that, although there was a large amount of interest shown by the residents of West Littleton in developing a Neighbourhood Plan, the support for a plan in Tormarton may not be strong enough to warrant the development of a Parish wide plan that would cover both villages. As well as needing strong grass roots support, for the development of a two-village plan to be feasible it would also need the support of at least three or four willing volunteers from Tormarton to help develop the plan. As a Parish Council this leaves us with two options, we either try and drum up enough support in Tormarton so that the two villages can develop a parish wide plan, or in the absence of that, we support West Littleton in their wish to develop a Neighbourhood Plan for their own community, if necessary, independently from the rest of the Parish.

It should be noted that should the latter were to be the case, and West Littleton does go on to produce its own independent Neighbourhood Plan, then Tormarton village would have no statutory document to guide planners for what the village wants or feels would be acceptable in development for its own future.

So, to help the Parish Councillors decide which one of these two options they should support I have been asked to call one final meeting for the residents of Tormarton to gauge public support, and hopefully find three or four willing volunteers to join West Littleton and help work on a joint plan for the whole Parish.

The meeting will take place at 'The Compass Inn' on Wednesday 1st November at 8.00 pm

# You could save a life! - DEFIBRILLATORS

We have TWO AED (Automated Electronic Defibrillators) available locally, one by the entrance to the Village Hall in Tormarton and one near the village noticeboard in West Littleton.

NO training is necessary to use them BUT they are the best way to save someone's life if they have gone into cardiac arrest - and time is of the essence.

If you think that someone has had a cardiac arrest (that is they are not obviously breathing or responding to you) you should:

- 1) Dial 999 and shout for help
- 2) Start doing CPR the 999 operator will talk you through this, you DON'T need to breathe into anyone's mouth, just do chest compressions.
- 3) Send someone to get a defibrillator if you can. These do not need any specialist training to use. They talk you through how to use them and will only deliver a shock if the onboard computer thinks it's appropriate.

#### Using a defibrillator fast after a cardiac arrest saves lives

The Defibrillator case **DOES NOT need a code** – just twist the cover to remove and access.

#### NATIONAL TREE WEEK Saturday 25 November – Sunday 3 December

The South Glos Council, SGC, tree voucher scheme is back.

This year the Council is working with three local tree nurseries to promote tree planting at home and they will be giving away 250 free vouchers for residents to claim and plant their own tree.

This is part of the SGC plan to plant enough trees by 2030 to double the tree canopy and improve biodiversity which will help to keep our local environment healthy.
