PARISH COUNCIL NOTES from the Chairman

Spring really is just around the corner, honestly!

...and in tune with the season of new beginnings, the Parish Council are pleased to announce that we have finally secured a new Clerk for the parish who will be starting with us from the 1st of March. To make the transition as smooth as possible our current Clerk Jack will be working alongside him for the first couple of months and sharing his knowledge. I will save the formal introductions until the next Newsletter, where we are hoping that our new Clerk will be able introduce themselves personally with a few words.

In other news, a huge thank you to Councillor Katy Pool for all her work to secure a grant from Avon & Somerset Police Community Trust for an upgrade of our speed signs. The grant will pay for the conversion of our VAR signs to solar power, which will save the Parish council several thousand pounds per year, as well as making them a lot 'greener'. As you can imagine, there were a great number of hoops that needed to be jumped through to secure such a large grant, and thankfully Katy cleared all of them to make the application a resounding success.

We have also had an update from the team driving the 'Neighbourhood Plan' forwards. The team have already met a couple of times, and I am excited to announce that a village meeting, similar to the one that took place in Marshfield a few weeks ago, has now been planned for our Parish. The meeting will take place in the village Hall on Wednesday the 20th of March, and details will be circulated in leaflet form to each house, and via the usual social media channels. This next step in the process will aim to help the group start the consultation process with residents, and find out exactly what's important to them, and what they may want any final plan to look like.

The next meeting of the Parish Council is currently planned to take place at the village hall on Monday 18th March 2024 at 6:30pm. As always, Parish Council members will welcome your attendance and contributions in person on the night. You could save a life! - DEFIBRILLATORS

We have TWO AED (Automated Electronic Defibrillators) available locally, one by the entrance to the Village Hall in Tormarton and one near the village noticeboard in West Littleton.

If you think that someone has had a cardiac arrest (that is they are not obviously breathing or responding to you) you should:

- 1) Dial 999 and shout for help
- 2) Start doing CPR the 999 operator will talk you through this, you DON'T need to breathe into anyone's mouth, just do chest compressions.
- 3) Send someone to get a defibrillator if you can. These do not need any specialist training to use. They talk you through how to use them and will only deliver a shock if the onboard computer thinks it's appropriate.

Using a defibrillator fast after a cardiac arrest saves lives

The Defibrillator case **DOES NOT need a code** – just twist the cover to remove and access.

NATURE NOTES Are You Hedgehog Aware?

Did you know that the population of Britain's hedgehogs has declined by between 30 and 70% since the millennium? The main threats to hedgehogs, beside the obvious road collisions are:

- habitat loss tidy gardens, garden fences and walls
- chemicals insecticides and slug pellets
- mowers and strimmers
- steep sided ponds and cattle grids with no slope or ramp for them to climb out

So what can we do to help?

- make sure the hedgehogs can move around easily with access holes in your boundary fences or walls they travel up to a mile at night foraging for food
- provide a simple safe source of water in dry weather
- reduce or eliminate the use of insecticides and slug pellets
- leave an untidy and undisturbed corner in your garden for a hedgehog to sleep and hibernate
