A Season of Remembering

What we do in church so often follows the patterns of nature and the seasons. Last month was all about thanksgiving and fruitfulness as we had wonderful harvest celebrations in each of our churches. It was also a time to give thanks for Sally's ministry amongst us, to celebrate all the love she brought to us and then to bid both Sally and Bob farewell.

November has a different feel. As autumn turns to winter, and the once-golden leaves fall to the ground, we enter a month where we think about very different themes. First, we have All Saints' Day where we celebrate and remember God's love and grace at work in people whose lives the Church as a whole has recognised. We then move to All Souls' Day, a chance to remember those we have known personally, who gave us life and loved us. And then almost immediately we turn our minds to Remembrance Sunday. All of these days help us explore powerful themes of loss, self-gift, memory and forgetting.

To ponder all those themes as the leaves dry, brown and fall is poignant. One of the amazing thing about trees is that even as the autumn leaves fall, the buds for next year's leaves are already in place waiting for spring to come. In fact, most trees produce their buds in high summer and it is only as the leaves fall that, if we look carefully, we notice them. The trees are waiting. They have everything they need and during the winter will draw in extra moisture and nourishment, ready in the few months' time to burst into life again.

As we enter November and also a period of waiting until the appointment of a new vicar for our benefice, I am encouraged to remember that even in times of loss, God gives us what we need and has already begun to bring new life again. Acknowledging the fallen leaves is important but so too is noticing all the buds waiting to spring into life again.

November always reminds me of a wonderful poem by the German poet Rilke on the theme of autumn. He paints a picture of leaves falling in a slow and lingering descent but ends the poem with these words:

'But there is One who holds this falling Infinitely softly in His Hands.'

So, let's enter November, aware of the falling leaves but also knowing that the buds of new life are already here and that we are lovingly held in God's hands as we wait for spring to come.

- 6.00pm in Cold Ashton Church. Join us in remembering and in praying for peace in our times.



Goodbye and thank you! A Celebration of shared village life

'Goodbye' – actually comes from the expression 'God be with ye' and as I leave my role as Vicar of Marshfield Benefice it seems a fitting message to each of you.

I arrived in October 2012, so what does 13 years of shared ministry look like in our Benefice? Number wise - we've had 139 weddings and wedding blessings, 131 baptisms, 225 funerals, around 120 school assemblies. 12 school leavers services, with those first year 6 pupils now 24 yrs old; 140 seniors' lunches in the company of some fabulous characters...a global pandemic with the shock of lives turned upside down but also extraordinary resilience and creativity shown in our communities helping us all through and the emergence of Zoom and Microsoft Teams as part of our everyday lives (argh!) ...104 Christmas services, 60 church and school Easter celebrations where we have joyfully declared - 'Christ is Risen! He is Risen indeed, Hallelujah!': 44 harvest suppers or lunches, 10 Plough lunches, 3 DAC awards for two of our churches, an Eco Silver award for sustainability and 12 toilets twinned around Marshfield, 12 Candlemass celebrations, 2 Royal Jubilees, the death of a much-loved Queen and the Coronation of a new King; 24 Remembrance services, the 100th anniversary of the end of WW1, the 70th, 75th and 80th Anniversaries of D Day and VE Day, the honouring of two Veterans, Tom Hall and Bill Billet, with the Légion d'honneur for their role on the Normandy beaches...Then there's open gardens, choral music fitting for cathedrals, madrigals, the town band playing at fetes, and choirs of 70 gathered for festivals with Good Friday taking us into the beauty and mystery of God's love in Christ - plus the ordinary everyday encounters with parishioners whether in church, school, hall, or community centre, in the local pubs, café, shops, or just out walking...

We have travelled through a lot together and I have been wonderfully supported by Bob, our hardworking churchwardens and our faithful ministry team, including 3 curates along the way!

There is too much to recall and too many of you to acknowledge, but I give thanks for all - the tough bits, the fun bits, and the divine presence threaded throughout.

Thank you for the relationships I have enjoyed with you whether you count yourself a church member of not - I hope you have seen something of God's love in me, and I pray: 'God be with you' – Goodbye, *Sally x*
