THE TORMARTON CHURCH CRACK - update from Stewart Waters

The repairs to the crack in the east wall of the Church have been addressed and not unsurprisingly further work was identified as being necessary when the scaffolding was erected and the coping stones removed. Wells Masonry have completed this work and are now resetting the cross which was beginning to lean. We are pleased to have completed these works before winter set in and hence avoided further internal staining. Thank you to those who donated towards the fund and ensured that we continue to have a functioning church building. Whilst costs exceeded the total donated we are fortunate on this occasion to have sufficient funds to cover the additional cost.

PARISH COUNCIL - Notes from Chairperson Katy Pool

The first **Your Voice** meeting for Area 2 – Yate and Cotswold Edge – was held on 13 October, attended by South Glos Council, Avon & Somerset Police, Fire & Rescue and other local community groups. The Parish Council was represented at the meeting and took the opportunity to raise a number of issues such as local burglaries, co-operation between Avon & Somerset Police and Wiltshire Police, road safety, the lack of PCSOs in our area, and the role of VAR in securing speed restrictions in our villages. Discussions are on-going. All residents are welcome to attend these meetings and we'll advise you on future meeting dates and times.

It has been agreed with Chris Palmer, Neighbourhood Plan Steering Committee Chair, that a Neighbourhood Plan for the parish shall no longer be progressed. Government funding has been axed and there was insufficient interest and support within Tormarton to drive it forward.

The minutes of our last Parish Council meeting will soon be available on the village noticeboard and on our website Home-Tormarton Parish Council. The next PC meeting will be held on Monday, 3 November at 6.30pm in the village hall and all are welcome to attend. Retrofit West, funded by the West of England Mayoral Combined Authority, will be attending our meeting to explain how they can help residents with insulation, glazing and heating advice to create a comfortable, greener and most cost-effective home.

You could save a life! - DEFIBRILLATORS

We have TWO AED (Automated Electronic Defibrillators) available locally, one by the entrance to Tormarton Village Hall and one near the village noticeboard in West Littleton.

NO training is necessary to use them BUT they are the best way to save someone's life if they have gone into cardiac arrest - and time is of the essence.

Using a defibrillator fast after a cardiac arrest saves lives

The Defibrillator case **DOES NOT need a code** – just twist the cover to remove and access.
