Cotswold Edge Ministry Team Letter

Are you ready?

"If I'd known you were coming, I would have got the room ready!". Ever had a surprise guest, particularly one who needed feeding or housing? It can be a little awkward – you want to welcome them of course, but your face shows the frantic processes in your mind of things that now need sorting. It's much easier when we know what to expect, when the guest is coming and line up the tasks in advance.

Advent is a time of expecting a Guest. This period is for waiting or preparing – for two things. The obvious one is Christmas, as we count the four weeks (in old times it was six!) up to the celebration of Christ's first coming. The second advent is that time when Christ will return. His other promises have proved reliable, so we can confidently expect this to happen in his good time. We are called to spend these Advent weeks in particular looking forward to that.

Some of the Bible passages that refer to his return use the word applied to a visiting dignitary or a Caesar. The townsfolk would go out to meet them on the road, and escort them back into the city with appropriate fanfare. Thus when Christ returns, he won't whisk us away to leave earth behind (as some popular TV series have mistakenly portrayed it), but he'll come to earth to reign here and renew it completely.

If that's what we can expect, how might we prepare? What tasks have we got that will make a welcome for this returning King? It means that creation care makes sense, working for good is worthwhile, bringing heaven to earth becomes a valid goal – known elsewhere as 'Your Kingdom come'. If even our most mundane service is making this world draw closer to God in Jesus, then we are doing Advent properly.

John Wesley was reportedly asked if he knew that Christ was coming tomorrow, what would he do. He said he would carry on doing what he had already planned to do – he was that confident he was preparing properly!
