**Your Voice** The Parish Council has received a detailed response from Insp Barnaby Mabbett to the questions raised at the October Your Voice meeting. Please contact our clerk if you would like a copy of that response. The next Your Voice meeting will be held at Yate Academy on Mon 26 Jan, 6.30pm – 8.30pm and all are invited to attend or to submit a question for one of your parish councillors to raise at this meeting. The meeting is organised by South Glos Council and is attended by Avon & Somerset Police, Avon Fire & Rescue, together with other agencies and community groups.

**Retrofit West** – Beth Searle from Retrofit spoke at the October PC meeting. Retrofit was set up by the West of England Combined Authority as a not for profit, community interest company. It is primarily an advice service, to improve people's energy efficiency in their homes. Their goal is to improve people's confidence in accessing services to improve the efficiency of energy in their homes, as the trades people are all vetted to ensure they meet set criteria. They can also offer a significantly lower cost service to those residents with low incomes, where a home visit will take place and a short report of recommendations will be provided. They will also prepare a full home report for their home for those who are interested and able to pay. Information leaflets are available from members of the Parish Council.

**Village Speed Limits** We have recently submitted a request to improve road safety within Tormarton, requesting that all current 40mph limits are reduced to 30mph and all 30mph to 20mph. A similar request is already logged for West Littleton to have a 30mph speed restriction introduced. We will update you as and when we have feedback and further information.

# PATRICK JOHN GENT - 23/04/1937 to 18/11/2025

Patrick was the younger son of John and Eve Gent of Manor Farm and younger brother of Peter Gent. Having passed School Cert at Wycliffe College Patrick came home, aged sixteen, to join the family farm. He enjoyed cricket and scored many runs for Tormarton playing with Denly Gent.

In 1962 Patrick married Mary Jane Perry – daughter of the local farm vet – and they had three sons, Michael, Andrew and Christopher. He expanded the business and the farm, buying land and enlarging the dairy herd.

Patrick was a steady contributor to the locality and was involved with and helped run the Parish Hall, the Parish Council, the Playing Field and Pavillion. He drained the village pond (now the playground) across his meadows. He was a Prison Visitor, part of the Child Contact Centre and Chairman (2001-3) of Yate Magistrates (in which guise he was served tea at Buckingham Palace by the then Prince Andrew).

Patrick and Jane and their sons first lived at Ivy Cottage (now the Smithy) next to Grange Farm from where he encouraged young George Gent to climb over the very high garden wall and ten years later displayed his patience with George's ineptitude in the Manor Farm milking bail with his usual wry smile, gentle chuckle and brief comment.

Everyone got on well with Patrick – village, Round Table, Magistrates, farmers, neighbours, family ....we have all been lucky to have known him.

There will be a Celebration of Patrick's life in Tormarton Church at 11.15 am on Monday 5th January

**Your Voice** The Parish Council has received a detailed response from Insp Barnaby Mabbett to the questions raised at the October Your Voice meeting. Please contact our clerk if you would like a copy of that response. The next Your Voice meeting will be held at Yate Academy on Mon 26 Jan, 6.30pm – 8.30pm and all are invited to attend or to submit a question for one of your parish councillors to raise at this meeting. The meeting is organised by South Glos Council and is attended by Avon & Somerset Police, Avon Fire & Rescue, together with other agencies and community groups.

**Retrofit West** – Beth Searle from Retrofit spoke at the October PC meeting. Retrofit was set up by the West of England Combined Authority as a not for profit, community interest company. It is primarily an advice service, to improve people's energy efficiency in their homes. Their goal is to improve people's confidence in accessing services to improve the efficiency of energy in their homes, as the trades people are all vetted to ensure they meet set criteria. They can also offer a significantly lower cost service to those residents with low incomes, where a home visit will take place and a short report of recommendations will be provided. They will also prepare a full home report for their home for those who are interested and able to pay. Information leaflets are available from members of the Parish Council.

**Village Speed Limits** We have recently submitted a request to improve road safety within Tormarton, requesting that all current 40mph limits are reduced to 30mph and all 30mph to 20mph. A similar request is already logged for West Littleton to have a 30mph speed restriction introduced. We will update you as and when we have feedback and further information.

# PATRICK JOHN GENT - 23/04/1937 to 18/11/2025

Patrick was the younger son of John and Eve Gent of Manor Farm and younger brother of Peter Gent. Having passed School Cert at Wycliffe College Patrick came home, aged sixteen, to join the family farm. He enjoyed cricket and scored many runs for Tormarton playing with Denly Gent.

In 1962 Patrick married Mary Jane Perry – daughter of the local farm vet – and they had three sons, Michael, Andrew and Christopher. He expanded the business and the farm, buying land and enlarging the dairy herd.

Patrick was a steady contributor to the locality and was involved with and helped run the Parish Hall, the Parish Council, the Playing Field and Pavillion. He drained the village pond (now the playground) across his meadows. He was a Prison Visitor, part of the Child Contact Centre and Chairman (2001-3) of Yate Magistrates (in which guise he was served tea at Buckingham Palace by the then Prince Andrew).

Patrick and Jane and their sons first lived at Ivy Cottage (now the Smithy) next to Grange Farm from where he encouraged young George Gent to climb over the very high garden wall and ten years later displayed his patience with George's ineptitude in the Manor Farm milking bail with his usual wry smile, gentle chuckle and brief comment.

Everyone got on well with Patrick – village, Round Table, Magistrates, farmers, neighbours, family ....we have all been lucky to have known him.

There will be a Celebration of Patrick's life in Tormarton Church at 11.15 am on Monday 5th January
